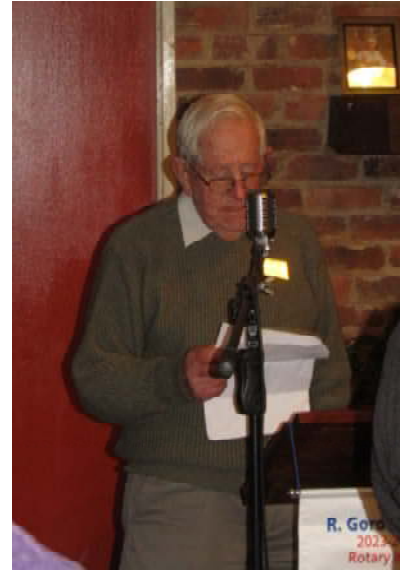
The District Governor is visiting us on the 28th August -- Partners are invited and we hope to have a fun evening.
